As good as modern favourites as far as requirements for a white show potato go. The variety also had a great reputation for excellent flavour and good cooking characteristics. Disease-wise it is susceptible to blight but it was regarded as a vigorous, reliable cropper at its peak when we grew it commercially many years ago.
